

Class Descriptions

Acting: Through theatre games, exercises and improvisation, students are introduced to theatre terms and techniques.

Acting, On Camera: This audition skills class covers theatre and camera vocabulary, poise, improvisational exercises, and differences between acting on stage and acting for the camera.

Arts Sampler: Explore a different art media each day through age-appropriate experiences in the arts.

Chess I, II, III & IV: Learn to play chess while improving attention span, concentration and problem-solving skills.

Clay: Use slab and wheel techniques (if time allows) to create pieces that will be kiln fired.

Clay Things: Each week features a different project and introduces a new way that clay can be used as a medium. Work will be kiln fired.

Clay/My Personal Zoo: Sculpt your favorite real or fantasy animals in clay and build a mixed-media habitat for your creations. Works will be kiln-fired.

Drama & Storytelling: Begin using your body, voice and gestures to bring story characters to life!

Drawing & Painting: Furthers the development of basic skills through creating three-dimensional objects on a two-dimensional surface.

Fiber Fun: An intro to knitting and weaving using traditional and non-traditional materials.

Hula: Learn the gentle art of Hula, its history, and the language of the dance.

Make a Piñata: Craft miniature piñatas and create figures, animals and sea creatures.

Mixed Media: Use traditional and non-traditional, cast-off & found materials to create 3-dimensional works. Transform the mundane into the marvelous!

Musical Theatre: Dancing, singing, and movement with text fill this popular class! Performance on the last day of class.

Nature Collage: Younger children create bugs, caterpillars and butterflies with chenille stems, etc.

Origami: Explore the art of Japanese paper folding.

Pastels/Charcoal: Experiment with charcoals and pastels while learning the basic principles of drawing.

Printing: Explore the process of printing and produce projects using monotype, relief printing and stamping.

Robots, Spaceships & Aliens: Use everything from computer parts to clay to make creatures and vessels from outer space.

Poetry & Creative Writing: Students learn various techniques of writing and the Art of Words.

Watercolor & Painting: Projects using watercolor and paints.
